Dear Parents, Staff and Community Members,

Thank you to everyone who helped maintain the excellent teaching and learning at MLPS during my absence. The "village" certainly worked together to ensure no disruptions to school life.

Parents as Partners As you would already be aware Parent engagement in learning is known to lead to improved outcomes for students of all ages. Schools and teachers can support parent engagement by building partnerships to connect learning at home and school. The terms parent engagement and parent involvement describe how parents and families support their children's academic achievement and wellbeing. Parent involvement usually focuses on school-based activities such as attending events or volunteering in class. Parent engagement encompasses children's learning at home, at school and in the community, recognising the cultural and social diversity of families and communities. There is strong evidence linking parent engagement with improvements in academic achievement for children of all ages.

Traffic Management I have unfortunately spoken with two of our neighbours this week about traffic management issues on Third Avenue. There are two concerns that are causing frustration. Parents illegally parking at the 'No Stopping' yellow line directly adjacent to the Give Way sign, during school drop off and pick up. This is a significant traffic hazard especially when a vehicle is stopped at the Give Way sign giving way to oncoming traffic, as there is no room for oncoming traffic to manoeuvre. The other issue is parents parking on our neighbour's verges, damaging sprinklers and impacting the visibility of traffic hazards as they use their driveways. I urge you to be considerate of our neighbours, their property, and the road rules.

COVID 19 I regret to inform you that I also have bad news regarding COVID 19. We have a number of staff and students impacted by the virus at the moment. We are planning the best we can to minimise disruptions to the teaching and learning programs. With staff absences due to COVID 19 and other factors we do try to maintain a consistency with the relief provided. In these challenging times of teacher and labour shortages this is not always possible. I do apologise for the disruption that will occasionally occur. This is a timely reminder to keep our school community safe and if you or your child have cold or flu symptoms, or test positive to COVID-19, please stay home until symptoms resolve.

Ultraviolet radiation can penetrate clouds so do not be fooled when it's overcast. Protect yourself from the sun when the UV Index is 3 or above.













Broad brimmed, legionnaire and bucket hats protect the neck, ears, temples and sides of the face – offering very good sun protection to these vulnerable areas which are common sites for skin cancer. Baseball caps and visors do not provide adequate protection.

Learning Assisted Program (LAP) 2023

History of LAP

LAP has been running in Australia for over 36 years. It started as a program that provided students who were struggling with reading, although not to the degree that they were readily identified as students that needed help - so they were left to struggle on, finding learning to be more and more difficult and falling further behind. There was no organised support at that stage. It started by recruiting parents and other community members

AP was created to identify those students that required a little extra support. As volunteers (parents/student munity members) are the essential element in making this program function and be successful, the volunteers/tutors are giving a child two x 30 minutes sessions or 1 x 1 hour session of one on one attention. een the tutor and the student is primary to the programs effectiveness in bringing about change.

The individual time spent with a LAP child, making them feel important and having positive learning experiences enables the child to take these attitudes/knowledge/skills back to the classroom.

The program can be as simple as reading a book to a child, having a chat about their weekend, playing sight words and sounds, working on basic maths operations with concrete materials or gaining confidence
