School Gates

All students arriving before 8.30am need to enter the school from the Second Avenue gate. From 8.30am, the Centenary Gates on Third Ave will also be opened. As the supervising staff member leaves the gate it will be locked, at approximately 8.50. The gate on Third Avenue closest to Room 20 (Pre Primary) will be unlocked at this time to allow late comers to enter and parents to leave. This will assist us in keeping our students safe. The Second and Third Avenue gates will be locked at 9.15am and unlocked at 3.00pm. The gate outside Room 11 on Second Avenue remains locked for safety reasons.

COVID-19

As already communicated in a Connect notice last week we have students and staff absent, some with COVID-19. I would like to remind families of some very important considerations:

- If your child becomes a close contact, due to a person in your household being COVID-19 positive, please watch carefully for symptoms and conduct a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT)
- Please notify the school office and your child's teacher if your child tests positive to COVID-19, although we are no longer reporting cases to the department it does help us monitor class outbreaks
- We ask that you monitor your child/yourself for symptoms of COVID-19 and get tested and isolate until you receive a negative result if symptoms develop.
- If you or your child develop symptoms, please do not attend school.
- Rapid antigen tests are available from the front office

Before School Supervision

MLPS originally implemented before school supervision from 8.00am as we are not able to offer before school care on site. Duty of Care requirements are that staff supervise during this time. We would like to continue this provision however; it is becoming increasing difficult with the large numbers of students attending. We would like to remind families this service is in place when students need to be dropped at school earlier than 8.30am because parents need to go to work. Students sit quietly in the undercover area talking to friends, reading, drawing or engaging in other quiet activities.

Once you are registered you can search for more than 7000 recommended books from the online book list, log the books you have read during the challenge, write a review or "like" a book, view your bookshelf to see the books you have read during the challenge and track your progress.

What type of "books" can be included in the challenge? Reading can take you anywhere and can also take many formats. You can log comic books, graphic novels, magazines, newspapers, articles online, poems and of course books, books, books. Do I have to read books from the Premier Reading Challenge book list? No - the list is there to help you search for books of interest and reading level. You may log any book of your reading level you have read, and if you have enjoyed it, write a review and recommend it to others.

MLPS Board Meeting Summary March 23, 2023

Acknowledgement of Country: SM completed Acknowledgement of Country

The minutes of the meeting on 1 March 2023 were approved.

Reviewed action register.

Board Chair Report: SZ thanked SM and Helen Willox for work on Business Plan, as well as SM for work on Annual Report. SM also acknowledged work of Anthea Phoenix. SZ updated on investigation of Indigenous Polo design for uniform. School has decided to implement Reconciliation Action Plan and any consideration of uniform changes would be aligned with RAP.

Finance Report: LM discussed preliminary budget approved by Finance Committee last week. Budget should move from preliminary to operational by end of March. SZ suggested requesting students to present to Finance Committee directly when requesting permission to fundraise. Allowing students to do this will increase student voice and provide leadership opportunities to a more diverse student group. LM will have discussion at next Finance meeting about Parent representative.

Principal Report: SM reported that

- NAPLAN was almost completed, and PP on entry assessment was finished. PP results available immediately for use in classroom planning. Parents are provided with key information from on entry assessment.
- Discussed reminding parents of avenues to address concerns during the year so that a favourable outcome is reached. SM has provided information in Term 1 newsletter and may repeat later in year e.g. Term 3. TK discussed regular Term 1 and Term 3 repetition may be useful as reporting in School Survey does not allow any concerns to be resolved.
- SM reported school culture survey completed by staff, results showed consistently high ratings of satisfaction/agreement.
- SM updated progress with performance development process, which has been recently standardised by Department. Discussion highlighted differences between performance development and performance management.

Annual Report: SM discussed draft Annual Report. Board provided feedback on minor edits to spelling, naming, which SM will action. Discussion regarding behaviour data, changes in definitions, areas that have improved and areas that require focus.

Register of members, TOR & Code of Conduct: SZ reviewed key sections of Code of Conduct and present members signed register. **Review new Business Plan:** Discussed possible changes including:

- Having Acknowledgement of Country at start of document, and utilising an AOC that MLPS students created
- STEM part of school curriculum, not explicitly stated in Business Plan as BP aims to outline the points of difference at MIPS.
- Goal setting e.g. all Year 3 NAPLAN results at, or above, like schools. School feedback was that goals were intentionally aspirational as this supported the school to strive for optimal outcomes.

SM to take feedback to leadership staff

Policy review: Fundraising/Sponsorship: Clarified fundraising not possible from Board, however, school and P&C could fundraise. Minor edits to formatting provided.

Board visibility plan: SM discussed positive progress with visibility. Agreement that no additional strategies required. May need to complete similar strategies every 203 years so the community remains aware of the board functions. SM will show Board video to staff at Staff Development Day to increase staff awareness.

Next meeting Thursday 18 May at 5.30pm in the staffroom. Observers welcome.
