Dear Parents, Carers and Members of the School Community,

Today represents the half-way mark for Term 1, with 20 school days behind us and 20 days in front. I think it's safe to say that this term will be over before we know it. Last week the school Board met for the first time this year. You may recall that we called for parent representative nominations to fill vacant positions on the Board. With fewer nominations than vacant positions, I can announce that Sian Zador was re-elected to the school Board and furthermore, appointed to the role of school Board Chair at the Board's first meeting. Sian provided excellent leadership as Chair during her tenure, and her reappointment to the Board and Chair position provides the school Board with leadership continuing and stability.

At our first meeting we were able to discuss a summary of the feedback received from the school's annual survey of parents and carers. Feedback presents an excellent opportunity to listen, understand, reflect and learn. Feedback also provides an important opportunity to celebrate strengths and successes. With notification that our school can expect a Public School Review (PSR) in Term 3 of this year, your feedback regarding opportunities for school improvement will play an important part in our own internal review processes that will help us to prepare for the Department of Education's PSR.

Having read all of your feedback, there was a clear alignment between feedback from parents and community, and our school's internal feedback, observations, and reflections. This is a positive and healthy sign, with experience telling me that the greatest risk to school improvement is when a school is blissfully unaware of the opportunities for continuous improvement.

A practical example of this alignment is the additional classroom support we put in place for this year. In response to the question: What do you think the school should stop doing in 2024? a survey response indicated we should "Stop having large class sizes of 22+ without additional teacher assistance."

Leading into 2024, and prior to the collection of survey data, we intentionally increased the amount of classroom support for teachers and students by employing additional Special Needs Education Assistants. This was a deliberate strategy as we felt it important to strengthen support for our staff and students at the point of need in classrooms. The improvement to student outcomes resulting from this strategy is already evident.

Of course, there will also be instances where community feedback provides the school with an opportunity to listen and understand new perspectives. Whilst it's not always going to be possible for us to change what we do and how we do it, particularly in the short term, it's important you know that you are heard, and that all feedback is considered.

The awarding of Honour Certificates at assemblies is a practical example of our openness to feedback and when appropriate and possible, demonstrate our agility and responsiveness.

As a school, we understand that people will have different perspectives about Honour Certificates, and this holds true not just for community, but also for our staff. Whilst **what** we do and **how** we do it are important, the most important question for all of us is **why** we do what we do.

In response to your feedback, we have implemented a new system to accurately track Honour Certificate student data. In the first instance, the collection of this data will support us to identify any patterns or trends that will help us to better and more broadly understand our current practice.

Survey feedback also highlighted some consistent strengths that are valued by parents and community. These included:

- The provision of Lego and Chess Clubs
- The provision of after school activities such as Young Engineers
- Class assemblies

- Before school supervision starting at 8.00am
- After school stay and play

These valued practices will continue in 2024 and we understand the value they add to the life of the school, student outcomes and community.

This Friday is our first whole of school and community assembly for 2024. We believe that assemblies present a valuable opportunity for our school and community to come together and to be inspired by student creativity, to learn and to celebrate. We understand that the parents and carers of those students performing or receiving certificates or other awards value the opportunity to celebrate their child/children and with this in mind, we will reserve some of the community seating for these parents and carers.

I look forward to seeing you on the gate or at Friday's assembly.



Year 6 Fete


