Dear Parents and Carers,

As we begin the countdown to the end of the school year it is important to reflect on our performance and quest for school improvement. We measure community, staff, and student satisfaction with our annual surveys. Most areas had similar or better results in the agree or strongly agree category from 2022. The Board received 101 responses in the MLPS Parent Survey, up from the 99 responses in 2022 however down from the 138 responses in 2021. 19% of respondents came from the Year 4 and 18% from our Year 5 cohort. We continue to work at promoting the survey to our community to get robust feedback. There was one area of notable concern – when 20% of respondents Disagree or Strongly Disagree with – I understand the school's Business Plan.

The major themes identified in the **2023** MLPS Parent Survey from the combination of both the survey data and specific parent comments are:

- Before school supervision, Walker/ play based learning, P&C events, school clubs and assembly items rated highly in the survey and were recommended to continue in 2024.
- Respondents felt we needed to have swimming lessons in the warmer months.
- Parents would like to see more after school activities and canteen days in 2024.
- Inconsistent Leadership was flagged for improvement in 2024.
- Honour Certificates Various comments, some referencing continue to recognise students using honour certificates, others saying the current system is not working for their child and another response calling for a certificate for every child.
- Oversized Year 3 class was referenced as something that should be stopped in 2024.

The Board reviewed the survey results at its last meeting and will continue to consider, with the school, plans for improvement in 2024. Further communication about the parent survey, along with staff and student responses will be distributed next year. We thank everyone who responded to the survey and look forward to receiving your continued feedback. Remember you can always email or telephone, you do not need to wait for the survey to contact us.

It has been my pleasure to reflect on the magnificent work of staff, students and the community in 2023. I'd like to express my gratitude to everyone for their contributions. Firstly, the Board Chair and Secretary, Sian Zador and Tara Kelso, thank you. The work of the Board is often unseen and all the members of the Board work very hard to ensure governance of MLPS is at the highest standard. Tara is retiring from the Board, her expertise and efficiency as Board Secretary will be missed. The P&C and the subcommittees have again worked tirelessly for our school; funding items from the wish list and ensuring our school calendar is full of events. To the P&C President, Breanna Catania and your Executive Committee, thank you for your ongoing guidance and support for MLPS.

We have many programs and activities that run during and after school hours that add to the fabric of MLPS. One being junior netball! I'd like to acknowledge Mrs Mel Redmond for her coordination of the junior netball over the last 4 years. Mel has spent countless hours coordinating coaches and teams to ensure our students get to participate in what is one of the biggest team sports in Australia. Thank you.

MLPS has become synonymous with Chess. This is due to the expert tuition and promotion of the game by Mr Jim Richards, Mr Michael Richards, Mrs Joli Hernandez Mendez and this year Mr David Richards. Their tireless commitment to our students is significant and the growth and progress of our students' chess strategy is noteworthy. Thank you. Mr Jim Richards will not be continuing his volunteering in 2024 so an extra thank you to him for the countless hours he has devoted to chess at MLPS.

A school does not operate without proficient and resourceful office staff. We are so lucky to have the wonderful Julee Clark, Shannon Gunning and Jemma Taylor keeping our front of house joyful and calm no matter how busy we are or what is happening behind the scenes. Thank you.

To our students, thank you for the joy you bring us every day. A special thank you to our Year 6 Graduands, they have been a fabulous group of students who have lived our school vision of Together – learn, respect, inspire, create, celebrate. I'd like to acknowledge our school leaders in Eliza Bedford, Harrison Nilsen, Sophia Mahon and Cohen Dunning for their contribution to student life at MLPS.

Library

Returning library and reading books

It is that time of year again that all books are to be returned to the library. If you have any overdue books please return ASAP, you do not need to wait for your library day. Congratulations to Rooms 1, 3 and 6 who have achieved all students returning all their books.

To enable students to have access to books 365 days a year, Mount Lawley Primary have built a street library which will be placed outside of the school grounds at the end of term. Library Weeding

All libraries on a regular basis go through a process called "weeding". This is when books that are out of date, not being borrowed or damaged are removed from the library to make room for new books. This ensures the library collection is always up to date, in good condition and engaging for the students and allows new books into the library without the shelves getting overcrowded.




